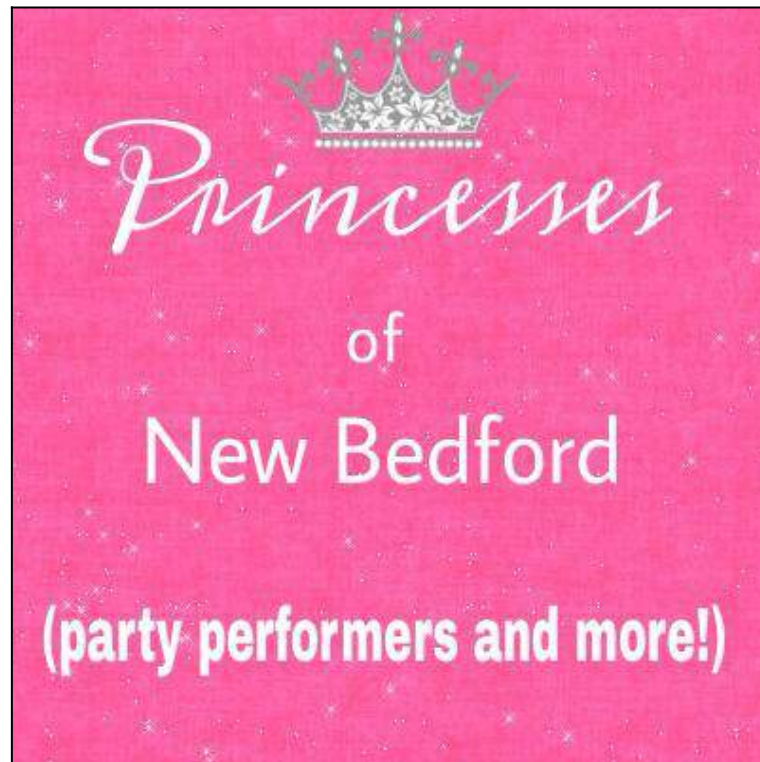


NBHS student starts children's entertainment business "Princesses of New Bedford"

Mother charged in New Bedford deceased infant case

The mother of the newborn baby discovered outside a home at 1065 County Street on April 11th was charged today in New Bedford District Court with the obstruction of justice portion of the witness intimidation statute and concealment of the death of a child born out of wedlock.

Tamlyn Gonzalez, 22, of 1065 County Street, was taken into custody this morning by New Bedford Police and will be arraigned on the charges in New Bedford District Court around 2:00 p.m. today.

The investigation into the case was coordinated by Assistant District Attorney Maryclare Flynn, who will also be handling today's arraignment.

New Bedford Police received a 911 call around 6:30 p.m. on April 11th from a resident who discovered the remains of the deceased infant outside of a three-story home at 1065 County Street. Police and rescue personnel rushed to the scene, and upon discovery of the deceased infant, contacted this office and state police detectives assigned to this office.

No further information regarding the facts of the investigation into this case can be released prior to arraignment. More details will be discussed in open court during today's court proceedings.

Double stabbing in Fairhaven

UPDATE (4:28pm, 30 June, 2014): The suspect from the Fairhaven stabbing that occurred Monday morning is identified as 27 year old Peter Bergeron. Bergeron was charged with two counts of domestic assault and battery by means of a dangerous weapon, two counts of assault with intent to murder and mayhem. He was arraigned at Third District Court and will be held without bail pending a dangerousness hearing.

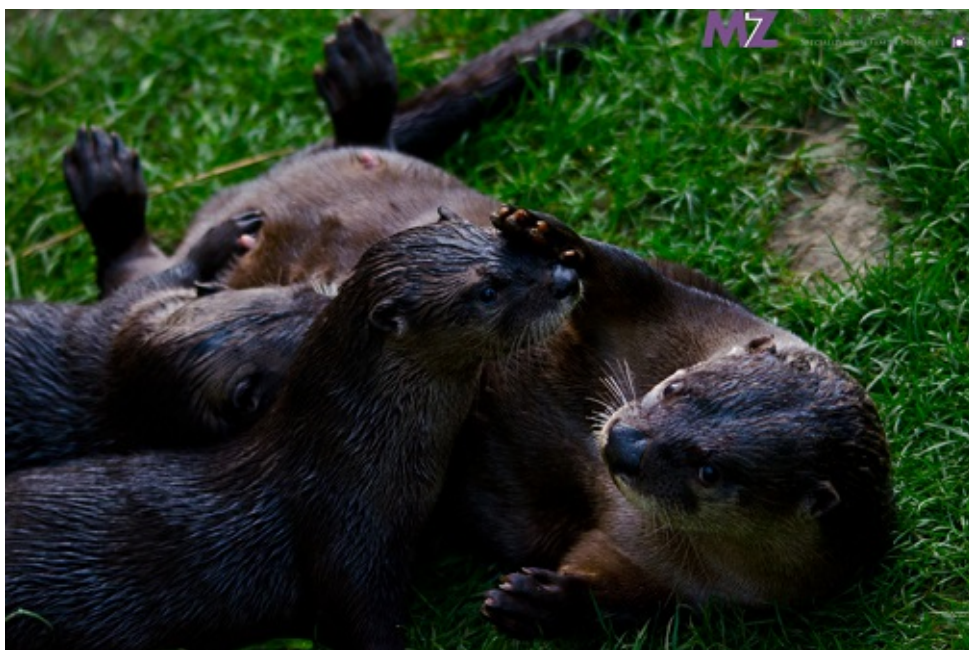
Fairhaven Police responded to 128 Washington Street just after 9:15am Monday morning after receiving reports that a female party entered that location suffering from apparent stab wounds. When police arrived, they quickly determined the stabbing occurred at a nearby residence.

Police located an adult female inside 128 Washington Street bleeding from a knife wound to her neck. Her husband was located at the next door residence, located at 126 Washington Street also suffering from knife wounds. A 27 year old suspect, believed to be their son, was taken into custody without incident.

Both victims were conscious and alert. After being stabilized by paramedics from the Fairhaven Fire Department, they were transported to St. Luke's Hospital for medical treatment. The suspect was arrested at the scene and also transported to St. Luke's Hospital, suffering from minor injuries believed to have been sustained during the assault.

The investigation is currently active and ongoing. The incident is being classified as a domestic violence incident. Criminal charges are imminent and will be determined as the investigation progresses. The names of the involved parties are not being released at this time, because it is unclear if family members have been notified.

Buttonwood Park Zoo Debuts River Otter Pups to Public

The Buttonwood Park Zoo's youngest residents, two North American river otter pups, made their public debut Tuesday, June 24th, 2014. After a special members' only naming contest Monday night, the pups' names are Cinnamon and Sugar.

The two North American river otter pups were born to first time mother, Dani, on March 19, 2014. Dani, 3 years old, arrived at the Buttonwood Park Zoo in April of 2013 from the Saint Louis Zoo and has since lived with the Zoo's two 4 year old male river otters, Duncan and Donut. Based on behavioral observations by the animal care staff, it has been determined that Duncan is the father of the new pups. The birth of these otter pups are result of a breeding recommendation of the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA) North American River

Otter Species Survival Plan (SSP). The goal of the SSP is to cooperatively manage otter populations within AZA accredited zoos to ensure the sustainability of a healthy and genetically diverse population.

Since the pups' birth, the Zoo's veterinary and animal care staff have been monitoring the growth of the otter pups. Dani and the pups have resided in an off-exhibit area of the Zoo while the pups matured and learned to swim. Shortly after birth, the two pups weighed about a quarter of a pound each and have steadily grown to their current weight of six pounds. Otter pups are born almost helpless and require significant care by their mother to survive. Although this is the first litter delivered by mother Dani, she has proven to be a caring mother and has done an excellent job raising the pups. As is normal for the species, the pups did not open their eyes until four weeks after birth.

When discussing this birth, Director of the Zoo, Keith Lovett, stated that "This is an exciting birth for the Zoo! River otters are one of zoo guests' favorite animals and this birth will allow the community to watch these pups grow to adulthood throughout the year while also learning conservation information about this local species."

North American river otters can be found throughout the United States and Canada in freshwater ponds, lakes, and marshland habitats. The otters' diet consist mainly of aquatic organisms, such as fish, turtles, crabs, and other aquatic invertebrates. By the early 1900s, river otters had declined throughout large portions of their historic range in North America due to water pollution, habitat loss, and unregulated trapping. Reintroduction projects and conservation initiatives have allowed river otter populations to re-establish in many of their native habitats.

HOURS OF OPERATION / ADMISSION

The Charles W Morgan is open to the public from 9 am to 5 pm daily from June 28 – July 6, with exception of Saturday, June 28 (she will be open 1pm – 5pm due to the Opening Ceremony in the morning). Last visitor boarding of the Morgan is at 4:30. Suggested admission: \$5.00

ACCESSIBILITY

The CHARLES W. MORGAN is the 2nd oldest historic vessel in the country, accurately restored and rigged for sailing. As an artifact, the conditions are not as consistent as in a building or on a modern boat. Visitors will need to cross a gangway to board the MORGAN, and the **vessel is not wheelchair accessible**. There may be tripping hazards, and there are steep ladders to go below deck. The events and exhibits along state pier including Mystic & New Bedford exhibits are wheelchair accessible.

Handicap Parking is available at the New Bedford High School on June 28, 29 and July 4,5,6; and at the Whale's Tooth on June 30 – July 3, **please click here to find out more.**

SAFETY & SECURITY OF THE HOMECOMING EVENT ON STATE PIER:

Bags, backpacks, suitcases & rolling bags, and any container capable of carrying more than 1 liter of liquid will not be allowed onto the State Pier. Pocketbooks, diaper bags and baby strollers will be searched at the screening area.

PARKING:

In addition to regular metered parking, the Zeiterion and Elm St Garages in the Downtown area, there will be free satellite parking available on Saturday, June 28, – Sunday, June 29, and Friday, July 4 – Sunday, July 6, at New Bedford High School, 230 Hathaway Blvd, New Bedford, with shuttle service provided (\$2 for round trip fare, Children under 12 ride free). 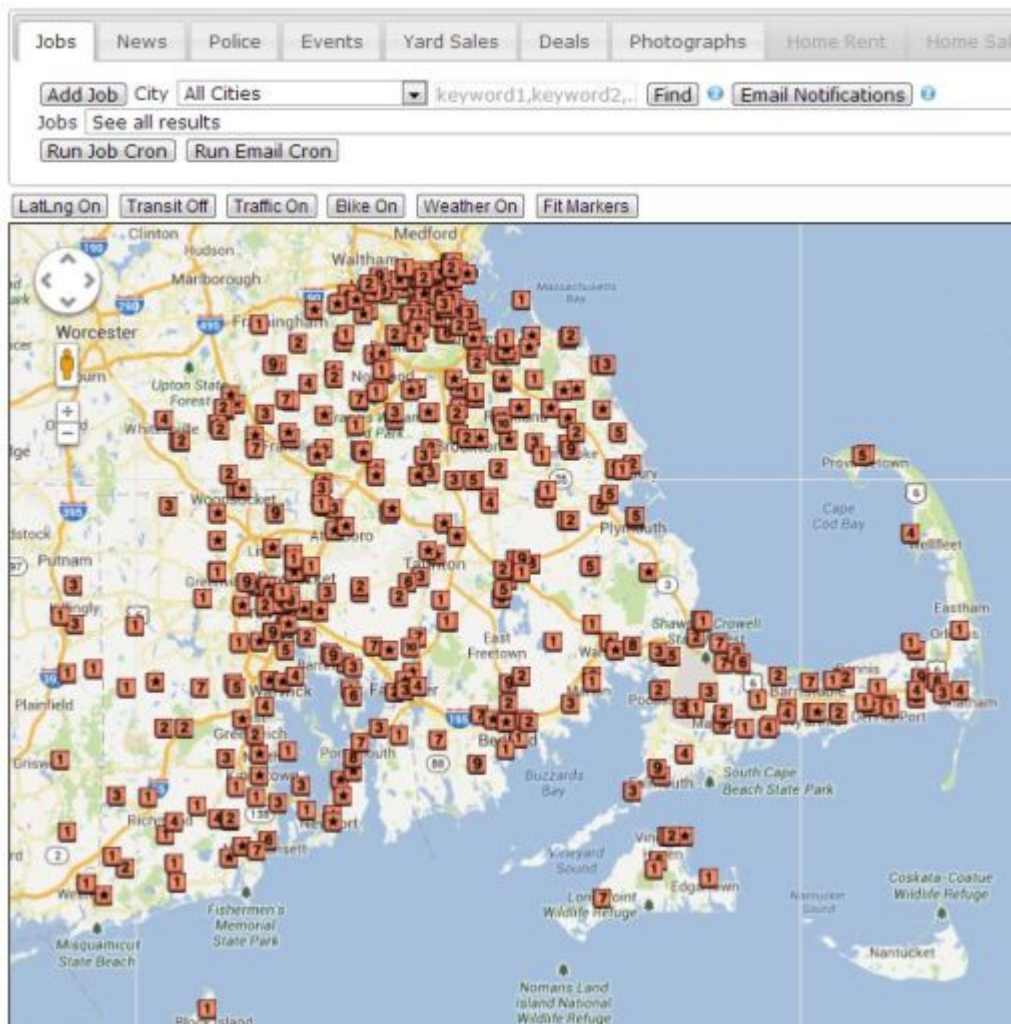

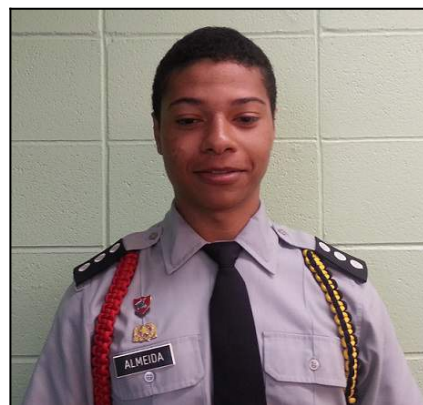

NBHS student selected to represent Massachusetts at prestigious Boys Nation

New Bedford High School junior Dyllan Almeida will represent Massachusetts next month as a Senator to Boys Nation, a prestigious leadership and citizenship program. A member of the Class of 2015, Dyllan was one of about 400 young men statewide selected to participate in Boys State, held last week at Stonehill College in Easton, MA. At Boys State, Dyllan and one other young man were elected by their peers to represent Massachusetts at Boys Nation, which will be held July 18-25 at Marymount University in Arlington, VA, and various sites in Washington, DC.



Dyllan Almeida will serve as one of 98 Senators from across the country at a young men's leadership program in the Washington, DC area next month.

Superintendent Pia Durkin said, "We are so proud of Dyllan for representing New Bedford at Boys State, and for being chosen among many other student leaders to represent Massachusetts at Boys Nation. Dyllan has distinguished himself as a true scholar and leader at New Bedford High School."

Dyllan is an incoming battalion commander in the JROTC program at New Bedford High School. He has received many commendations, including the Superior Cadet Award, Julius Goldman Leadership Award and the George Marshall Leadership Award. Earlier this year, he was selected to participate in the U.S. Air Force Academy's Diversity Visitation Program. He spent three days at the Academy in Colorado Springs, CO, to experience all aspects of cadet life.

Dyllan has excelled academically in Advanced Placement courses at the high school and is a member of the Whaler Tennis Team. He has volunteered more than 400 hours of community service, is active

in his church community, and is on track to become an Eagle Scout. Sponsored by The American Legion, Boys State programs are offered in 49 states (all but Hawaii), educating young leaders about the structure and function of state and local governments. At Boys Nation, delegates learn about the federal government. During the week-long program, the young Senators organize into committees and conduct hearings on bills submitted by their peers. The all expenses paid trip includes lectures, forums and visits to federal agencies, institutions, memorials and historical sites. The delegates also will meet with elected officials from their home states on Capitol Hill. The first Boys Nation – then called Boys Forum of National Government – convened at American University in Washington in August 1946.

Dyllan was sponsored for the program by American Legion Post 280 in Mattapoisett.
