“Our zookeepers tell us that the animals feel the heat like we do,” said Zoo Director Keith Lovett. “With the exception of the Emily and Ruth, our animals are native to North America. When the weather cools, some animals become more active.”

On this second Zoo Night, DJ Steve of Music and Motion will entertain with tunes for the whole family to enjoy, and youngsters can create a totally awesome turtle. For members, admission cost is \$6/adult and \$3/child; non-memers \$10/adult, \$6/child.

strolling through the Zoo in the cool of the evening.”
