41st Annual Cape Verdean Recognition Parade (11:00 am – 12:00 pm)

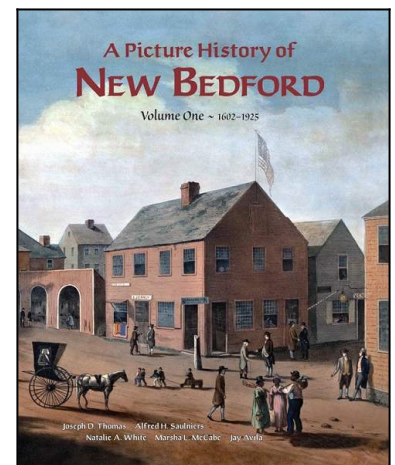
