

District Chief Scott Kruger appointed acting Deputy Fire Chief for City of New Bedford

District Chief Scott Kruger has been appointed acting Deputy Fire Chief for the City of New Bedford. A selection committee comprised of current acting Chief Paul N. Coderre, Jr., Fairhaven Fire Chief Timothy Francis, and Personnel Department staff recommended Kruger for the position following a competitive selection process.

Kruger takes over the Deputy position from Coderre, who himself served as Deputy Chief from 2011 until December 2018 when Coderre was appointed acting Fire Chief upon the announced retirement of Chief Michael Gomes.

District Chief Kruger has served the City since 1991 beginning as an EMT with New Bedford EMS in 1991, and joining the New Bedford Fire Department in 1993, serving as a firefighter from 1993-2001, as a Lieutenant from 2001-2006, as Captain from 2006-2010, and as a District Chief since 2010.

“Scott Kruger is a veteran New Bedford firefighter with a long record of distinguished leadership in the Department,” said Chief Coderre. “He is respected across the Department and will bring his commitment to public safety and serving city residents to his new role as acting Deputy Chief.”

Among other accomplishments, Kruger was recently recognized for his role in ensuring that emergency response vehicles in New Bedford are stocked with EpiPens, as well as with the drug hydroxocobalamin, known as a “cyano-kit,” which aids in the treatment of severe smoke inhalation.

Permanent appointments to the positions of Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief are subject to Massachusetts Civil Service

procedures that require eligible candidates to take promotional exams, and the Mayor to select from among the top-scoring applicants. The exam for Deputy Fire Chief is expected to be posted by the Commonwealth in May 2019.

Massachusetts State Police seeking public's help in Wareham fatal accident

An early morning crash on Route 195 in Wareham left one person dead and another being treated for minor injuries.

Preliminary investigation by Trooper Gregory Furtado indicates that at about 4:45 a.m. this morning, a 2012 Nissan Titan pickup was traveling on Route 195 Eastbound when it is believed to have struck a light grey dump truck. The Nissan then traveled off the right side of the roadway and crashed into the woodline. The truck believed to have been involved in this crash left the scene prior to the trooper's arrival.

The passenger in the Nissan, a 48-year-old Fall River man, was pronounced deceased at the scene. The operator, a 33-year-old man, also from Fall River man, sustained minor injuries and was transported to Toby Hospital in Wareham for treatment.

The cause of this crash, including identifying the truck and operator believed to have been involved and who left the scene of the crash, remains under investigation with assistance from the State Police Collision Analysis and Reconstruction Section, Crime Scene Services Section, and troopers assigned to the Plymouth County District Attorney's Office.

State Police were assisted on scene by Wareham Fire and EMS.

It is believed that the other truck which may have been involved may have damage to the left rear of the truck bed, including possible black paint transfer.
