Grupo Flor de Izote to present free concert, Thursday, August 15

The 2013 Thursdays in the Park Concert Series continues its weekly summer series with a performance of Central American music and dance by Grupo Flor de Izote. A spokesperson for the group explained, "The Izote flower is the national flower of El Salvador, the goal of our group is to maintain and promote the cultural values of El Salvador by involving youth in different events and activities. Dance reminds us that despite our troubles we can find and spread joy to others and keep the cultural roots of our ancestors alive."
