And on Friday, August 6, you can attend the Clasky Common Farmers Market, open from 2pm-6pm, where you can buy local foods from Coastal Foodshed's Mobile Farm Stand which sources fruits and vegetables, local meats, honey, and a number of other products from dozens of local farmers and food vendors.

If you can't make it to one of the Farmers Markets, you can always shop local and support farmers through Coastal Foodshed's Virtual Market which is open for shopping every Saturday at 8am until Monday at midnight. You can choose to have your local food delivered directly to your front door or you can pick it up at 38 Blackmer St. in New Bedford.
