Prescribing Pain Medication:

Our Southcoast Health staff understand that pain relief is important when someone is hurt or needs emergency care. However, providing pain relief is often complex. If you were prescribed any medications at discharge, please follow the administration directions exactly as prescribed. Mistakes or misuse of pain medications can cause serious health problems, and even death. Do not share or use another person's medications. Our Emergency Department will only provide relief options that are safe and appropriate. All medications should be kept in a secure location and away from children. All medication should be disposed of properly, as soon as it is no longer needed. Proper disposal information can be found on the Federal Drug Administration (FDA) web site (www.fda.gov). Additional disposal information can be obtained by calling the FDA's hotline at 1-888-463-6332. The FDA recommends that narcotic pain medicines be disposed of by flushing, because the risk of harm is completely eliminated from the home when the drug is flushed down the sink or toilet after it is no longer needed.
