Preregistered families in need of transportation may present their postcard for free bus access to the zoo courtesy of the Southeastern Regional Transit Authority (SRTA). A return trip STRA bus pass will be available at the SRTA table during the event from 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. to any registered family that requests one.

This is the fourth annual Smooth Sailing day of celebration. Last year's event was a huge success with 1,150 attendees, including 264 kindergartners.
